Mrs. Blair suggests these literary adventures for your summer vacation!

Like Pickle Juice on a Cookie by Julie Sternberg

"My hand missed Bibi." She would hold it and say, "This is the best hand. I love this hand." Bibi was soon-to-be third grader Eleanor's babysitter. Bibi has moved back to Florida to take care of her sick father. Eleanor is having a very bad August. In her own words, Eleanor shares what it feels like to lose someone very special who has been there every day of your life. It's as bad as a "spiderweb on your leg." But things get better. Meet the new people in Eleanor's life: upstairs neighbor Agnes who sings to Beatles' songs, babysitter Natalie who brings lemons and sugar for a lemonade stand, postal carrier Val who finally brings a letter from Bibi, and teacher Mr. Campanelli who has crazy hair if he's not careful.

The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate

Part true, part imagined, this heartwarming story shares the caged life of Ivan, a silverback gorilla, who lives with two elephants and a stray dog in a shopping mall. Ivan is based on a real gorilla who existed in a small cage for twenty-seven years before public protests led to his move to Zoo Atlanta. The extraordinary twist to this novel is that Ivan narrates the story. His observations about humans, his attachment to baby elephant Ruby, and his love for drawing make you root for Ivan and his friends and the life they deserve. You will not be able to put this book down. 2012 Newbery winner.

Secrets at Sea by Richard Peck

Helena, the oldest sister, feels deeply responsible for Beatrice, Louisa and Lamont. Her mother was killed by the barn cat and sadly her father and two other sisters drowned in a rain barrel. So Helena keeps an eye on her siblings as well as their upstairs human neighbors. When the Cranstons embark on a voyage to give their eldest daughter Olive "Her Chance" to find a suitable husband, the mice anticipate a crumb-free household and jump aboard. Despite a healthy fear of water and a one-eyed, "kill-crazy" cat, the mice delightfully discover a shipload of mice on the trip: handsome ship steward Nigel, elegant Lord Peter Henslow, and impressive Duchess of Cheddar Gorge, among others. If you liked Avi's *Poppy*, you'll love this hilarious, romantic, death-defying tale on the high seas.

Flora & Ulysses: The Illuminated Adventures by Kate DiCamillo

"Holy bagumba!" Ten-year-old Flora Belle Buckman's life takes a turn when she literally breathes new life (CPR) into a squirrel sucked into her neighbor's Ulysses Super Suction vacuum cleaner. The squirrel, newly named Ulysses, now thinks beyond "I'm hungry!", writing poetry and exploring his new superhero powers. Flora, a superhero comics fan, believes Ulysses is destined for greatness. One enemy stands in his way: Flora's romance-writing, self-centered mother who is determined to get rid of Ulysses. Flora's parents have split up – an arrangement Flora finds hard to accept. She hides her disappointment with a gloomy view on things but Ulysses breathes new life into Flora, helping her see the beauty in life even when those close to you let you down. Master storyteller DiCamillo has spun a hilarious and heartwarming tale. 2014 Newbery winner.
